Volunteers are needed to help with construction of a bat-friendly gate at Trout Cave in Pendleton County, West Virginia.

Trout Cave was historically the second largest Indiana bat hibernacula in the state and populations of this species in the cave have recently increased significantly. In order to protect and continue to restore populations of this federally-listed species, the entrances will be gated over the weekend of September 20th, which happens to coincide with the Fall VAR meeting in Covington, VA. The gate has been fully funded, primarily by the United States Fish & Wildlife Service, with additional contributions coming from the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources, Bat Conservation International, and of course, the National Speleological Society. After the gate is installed, the cave will be open for recreational and educational use seasonally from the 15th of April through Labor Day.

Volunteers are needed for Sept 18-21. Some prep work will occur on the 18th and 19th. The greatest need for volunteers will be on Saturday the 20th, with a continuing need on Sunday the 21st to wrap things up.

Arrangements to provide local camping and food for volunteers are underway.

Every effort to minimize damage to the hillside will be made, and plantings or other mitigation are also planned. Safety will of course be a major consideration. Those planning to assist should contact me at d270@bellatlantic.net. I will also be at the VAR meeting in Bristol next weekend for those that wish to discuss this with me. Additional details will be provided in subsequent postings.

The decision to gate the cave was made in accordance with the Cave Preserves' previously established management guidelines and will allow the area to be managed in a way that will maintain the Preserves' goals to protect and encourage the habitats and populations of endangered species while optimizing cave access. We recognize that the gating and winter closure is not universally supported, but are convinced that under the current conditions, this is the right thing to do. The Virginia Region has a long history of supporting the John Guilday Caves Nature Preserves' Management Committee, and we trust that support will continue. Thank you,

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#### 03/29/2008 Royston's Cave Greg McCoy

On Saturday March 29, 2008 Janet Tinkham, Nuch Songsason, Bob Grey, Jeff Jahn, Lauren Rexford, Marie Everhart and Greg McCoy visited Royston's Cave. Royston's entrance is a 40 foot vertical that can be free climbed with a belay. The intent of the trip was to see the large drapery that Royston's is famous for and to get a little vertical practice in the process.

The cave has many decorations including the small drapery in the front part of the cave and the massive drapery in the back, and deep rim stone dams. Marie and Lauren pushed a small lead on the right trending down from the drapery room. Above the flowstone ledge in the drapery room were two small clusters of little brown bats. Short trip, some vertical, lots of decorations and a massive drapery.

#### 04/13/2008 Front Royal Caverns Greg McCoy

On Sunday April 13, 2008, Marie Everhart, Carol Tiderman and Craig Hindman, Lauren Rexford and Greg McCoy joined Janet Tinkham and Keith Christensen do a bat count at Front Royal Caverns in preparation for the pending gate repairs. Keith was accompanied by his 6 year old son Connor. The bat count turned up 39 Eastern Pipistrell bats and 3 little brown bats. Connor had a great time caving and helping Marie, Greg, Lauren, Janet and Carol check out every little cranny for bats. Keith tested the temperature at various locations to determine if Front Royal Caverns is a possible location to foster a large bat population. The outcome of the survey revealed two problems: The top part of the cave is too warm to support bat hibernation while the lower part of the cave where the temperatures are cooler is prone to flooding. With regard to the gate, we decided to repair and complete the gate to restrict human access with no additional action to make the gate more bat friendly. The gate repairs are expected to take less than a day to complete including an improved human gate allowing easier access and a hand rail along the slope into the sink below the gate. Warren County may use the cave for cave / karst / groundwater education and the handrail will facilitate access into the sink.

A clean up of the sink, cave and surrounding property will accompany the gating project scheduled for June 2008.

#### 04/26/2008 Corkscrew Cave Greg McCoy

On April 26, 2008 Nikki Fox, Chris Coats, Kurt Waldren, Carl Amundson, Terry Mcclanathan, Brian Masney, Larry Hogston and Greg McCoy visited Corkscrew Cave in Tazewell County Virginia. The trip was a sport and photography trip. Corkscrew is home to Champaign Pit. We all arrived (most of us) at the meeting place on time and traveled to the cave. The land owner was gone on Farm Business and his wife greeted us then allowed us to drive across the property to a location near the cave. Skylar and Riley found a salamander in the twilight zone and were very excited to see it. This offered an opportunity to counsel them on caving ethics.

Morrill Cave was a popular cave on this Saturday. Perhaps a hundred people were just coming out of the cave, inside the cave, or going in the cave.

Skylar and Riley moved off ahead with other FRG members while Myracle and I worked at the slow pace of a 3 year old. Myracle was just getting her caving legs so the day began with many falls and lots of hand holding. We traversed the front main section of the cave to the climb-up known as the Devil's Staircase and turned around to come out. Near the main stream intersection (now blocked off) we met Gordon Birkhimer and his two girls, Morganna and Logan leaving the cave. Later in

After swimming, grandpa duties included ice cream, so we went to Sonic in Bristol for ice cream before taking the girls home to momma.





## Breathing Cave, the Vertical Trip by Nikki Fox

On Memorial Day, May 26, Chris Coates, Danny Cumbo, Jeff Noe and I headed to Breathing Cave to check out George's Gorge in the Old Section. For some reason, it seems that most who go to Breathing always explore the New Section (off to the right). Chris and I had gone on a winter trip to Breathing earlier in the year just to see this neglected section, which neither of us had been to. And we had quite the surprise in the passage! We were unable to push farther into the cave due to being blocked by two vertical drops.



So in this May trip we planned to see what **DEAD DOG DISPATCH**  lies beyond the Gorge. We hauled our 150 feet of rope through the crawls and rigged the drop using a natural anchor and two existing bolts as a redirect. Chris was the first to rappel, then Danny, Jeff and me. At the bottom of the Gorge, we headed right and continued until the passage got tight in a gravel bed. We knew there was more passage than that, so we headed back to the drop and explored the multiple levels on the left side. We found the spot where the other drop went below.



Danny Cumbo So we decided to head to the upper level and followed the main passage that way. The first challenging thing we came upon was a vertical mud wall that had footholds carved into it and a rope hand line that had a lot of stretch and bounce in it. On top of the embankment, we followed the same rope up another vertical slope. We found that the rope was anchored to two metal spikes driven into the mud floor! We didn't explore too much beyond that point and decided to head out due to time restraints.

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There were several leads we did not check out, including the highest level passage from the Gorge. I think this is another trip to be planned in the future when we have 8-10 hours to devote to the trip.

## Hancock Cave

On June 8, on the way back from the SERA/VAR held in Bristol, Tenn., Chris Coates, Todd Roberts, Danny Cumbo and Corey Hackley decided to find Hancock Cave in Smythe County.

After a little confusion with directions and trying to locate the parking area, Chris found the cave entrance next to a mailbox in the middle of the forest. We suited up, walked to the cave, rigged a hand line (as suggested by the registration desk) and entered. We went down about 30 feet on breakdown and then climbed up a passage to look back almost parallel to the entrance.

Another hand line was rigged down a short vertical drop with no footholds on the smooth rock. We then made our way to the Octopus Room with many different passages to choose from. We went a few different ways and eventually circled back to the same room. There were several high leads we did not take and opted to follow the main trunk passage further into the cave.



This main passage was sloping and a little exposed since you could see the lower level in some holes in the ground. We eventually made it to a crawl in a stream bed. On the other side we found a flood kit with a warning saying that if you had not checked the weather forecast for the day, you should turn around and head back.

From this point, the cave changed. The passage was lower, had more crawls and was decorated with formations. We made our way to a wall covered in formations. We stopped to take a group portrait and make photos of the area's speleothems. We spent a little more time pushing the passage, but decided to turn around and head back out for our long drive home still ahead of us.



On our way out, we all counted over 20 orange and black speckled cave salamanders hanging out near the entrance. I have never seen so many convened in the same area. This cave is definitely worth a return trip!
