Boonsboro, MD – On Saturday August 29, 2009, Tri-State Grotto again made a connection digging in Crystal Grottoes Caverns. Tri-State Grotto's goal was to join different passages in an attempt to make the commercial tour more circular.

The day started with a wildlife trip. We went looking for bats. We didn't find any. Sonny Floyd, who is also a guide at Crystal Grottoes,

said a few weeks ago he had seen a bat in the cave. He did point out a salamander in the back door passage. It is the Long Tail Salamander (Eurycea loongicauda longicauda), which is the only salamander that is yellowish with black vertical marks on its tail. Breeding underwater in the winter, the Long Tail Salamander produces a clutch of 90 eggs. It eats insects, worms, arthropods and other terrestrial invertebrates.

We also carried out buckets. There wasn't a line of people. You had to take it all the way out, no passing it off.






