

Tri-State Grotto Digs at Crystal Grottoes Caverns





As we started one of the Caverns workers and Zack were putting together two new wagons. This would give us three to use. As soon as they sent the first one to us we put it to good use. We have found that three buckets were the right amount for the wagons. Through most of the day we were running two wagons. In the afternoon, we ran all three wagons.

LIVING ON KARST

Back several months ago I was asked by Twila Carr of the WVDEP if I could come up with a cave that would be fairly easy access to allow the attendees of the 2009 Living on Karst Conference to see what it would be like caving. I picked out several caves but one-by-one they fell by the wayside. Between WNS & owners wishes it boiled down to one, Whitings Neck Cave.

The karst conference was to be held on September 14th & 15th at the US Fish & Wildlife Conservation Training Center near Shepherdstown, WV. Whitings Neck would be a good choice for several reasons. First & foremost it was close and easy to get to. Also there were several other reasons. Tri-State Grotto's formal stand on WNS is not to cave until the moratorium for WNS is lifted. We chose Whitings Neck because it is not a known bat hibernaculum. Counting bats on trips into the cave never accumulated more that 5-10 bats at most (sometimes none). We were also going to have a decon station set up for decontamination after the 'trip. The buses were also to be decontaminated after the trip also. Other factors were involved in choosing Whitings Neck. Most of the people who were along on the trip were novices & non-cavers. In other words they would

probably never go into another cave again (except for maybe commercial caves). Their wardrobes were non-caving. They had on sneakers, dress shoes, hikers, jeans, dress slacks, polo shirts, etc etc. Their 'gear' would also never see another cave. We supplied most of the helmets and they were also deconned. Also the owner's son was alright allowing us access for the sake of allowing people to go into the cave for a short distance to see what caving was like. We did a lot of thinking and planning before we finally said, OK, Whitings Neck it is.

Prior planning and work was done by Jeff Marcum, Corey and I to clear briars and downed trees from the trail on Sunday.

On Monday, September 14th, Paulette & I arrived at the karst conference about 7:15 am to set up a display about caving. Jerry Bowen showed up shortly after. Once we had everything set up it was time for Jerry & I to attend the sessions while Paulette manned the display. The sessions were for the most part very interesting & riveting. The speakers included geologists, biologists, scientists, and persons for companies who were the leaders in remedies for karst & sinkhole problems. The 'cave' trip was set to leave the conference about 1pm. Jerry and I headed to Whitings Neck Cave while the buses stopped by 2 other karst areas before arriving at the Whitings Neck property about 2 pm.

We set the trips up into 2 sessions. Each session would stop by a small pit called Scotts Rock Drop. From there they would be led to the main entrance to Whitings Neck. Each trip into the cave would be limited to 10. While those 10 were in the cave, the rest would head on to the Sinkhole Entrance (2nd Entrance). We had a hand line set up to allow each attendee to go down into the sinkhole entrance. Since the sinkhole entrance is a collapsed room it would give everyone a sense of being in a cave.



The 1st bus arrivals were met by John DiCarlo & John Pearson and lead to the main entrance of Whitings Neck cave by John DiCarlo. Of the 28 or so attendees, only about 22 or so wanted to go into the cave. We had people ages early 20's to their 80's. Some even had canes. Even they traversed down into the sinkhole where Bernie Wootten and sometimes Sean Wootten were helping where they were needed and answering questions. Mary Lynn Collis was also helping where she was needed. She helped bring people from the buses to the sinkhole entrance and the


main entrance area. She also helped in the passages of the cave.



The attendees who went into the cave got to do some 'real' caving. Vitas Eidukevicius and Sean were near the entrance to help when needed. There was a hand line at the climb down to the 1st ladder. Jerry Bowen was here at the bottom & sometimes top of the ladders helping out. Once in the entrance they had to climb down to a 5' ladder. Once down the ladder they had to climb up about 12' on another ladder. From there they had to crawl about 40' to 50' (most with no knee pads nor gloves). Remember some had on dress slacks & dress shoes too!



Once through the crawlway they had to slide/shinny down a flowstone slope to the 1st intersection in the cave. Here Nikki Fox had a hand line to help people get down & back up the slope. Some 'climbed' while others slid down on their butts. To get back up Nikki was instructing and pushing people back up the slope.



Corey Hackley was also at this point to answer questions and lead those brave soles who wanted to go further to see the big drop.

The 2nd session of attendees included about 50 people. Almost all of these wanted to see the cave! By the time we got everyone into the cave and back to the bus it was after 5 pm. Twila and the other karst organizers were hoping to get everyone back to the conference by 4 pm. OOPPSS!! That didn't happen.




