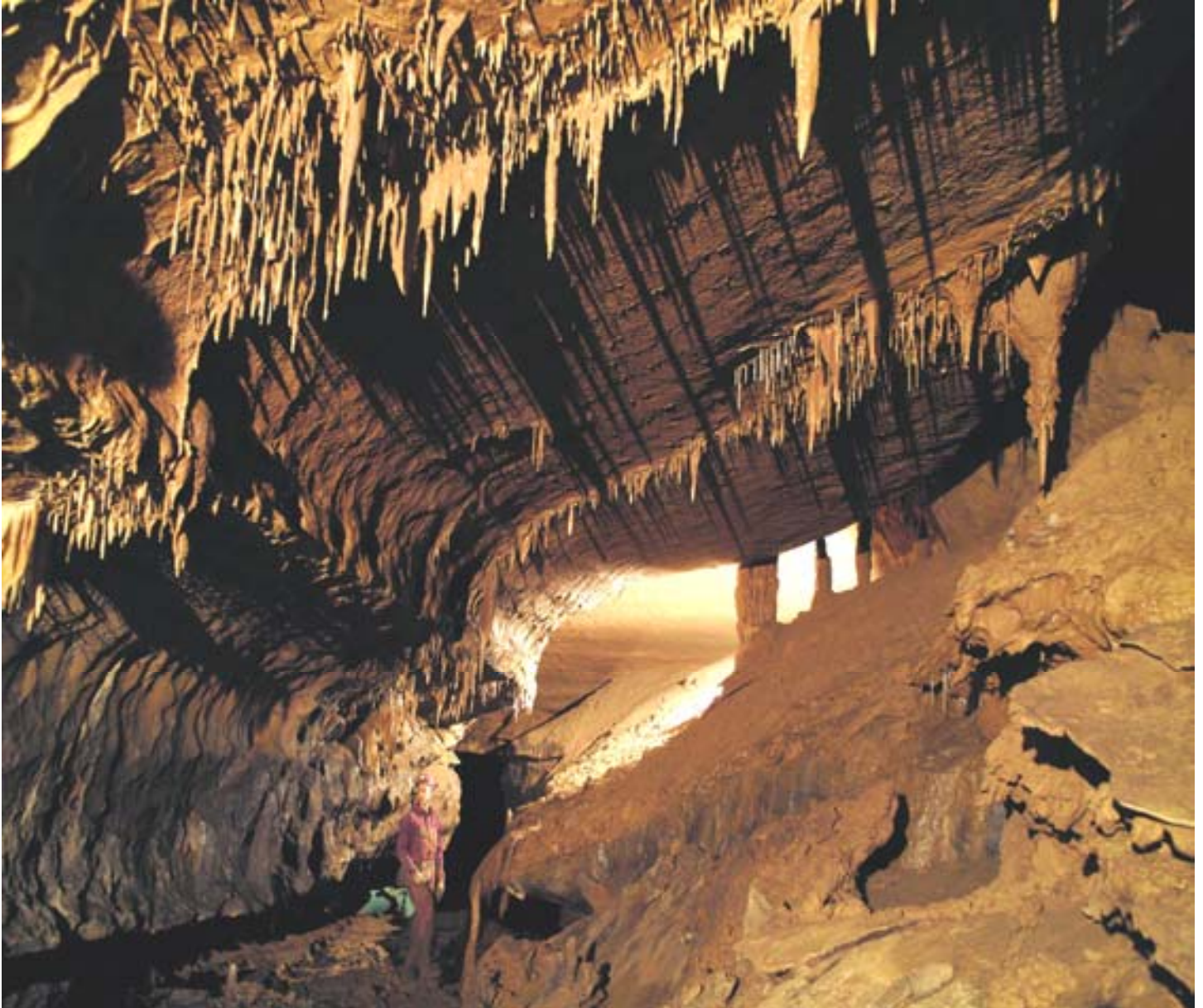

NORMAN SIDE OF BONE-NORMAN CAVE SYSTEM

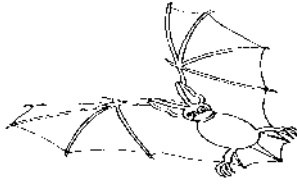

Subject: Science News: WNS fungus named

WHITE-NOSE FUNGUS GETS A NAME New research further elucidates bat-infecting fungus

SNOWBIRD, Utah— A fungus linked to bat die-offs has been named as a species new to science and has now been found on two continents, according to an update on the menace.

In what's known as white-nose syndrome, the fungus forms white patches on the noses and other exposed skin of hibernating bats. The moldy bats emerge from their winter shelters ahead of the normal schedule and die emaciated, as if they were starving.

The nose mold genetically resembles fungi in the genus *Geomyces*, mycologist Andrea Gargas reported July 28. And this threat to bats hibernating in winter thrives in cool temperatures, just as other genus members that attack frozen food do, said Gargas, of Symbiology, a private research firm in

Middleton, Wisc. Yet no other *Geomyces* species forms one-celled spores shaped like bananas. Based on these and other characteristics, Gargas and her colleagues named the species *G. destructans*, formalizing the nomenclature in the April – June *Mycotaxon*.

White-nose syndrome first came to scientific notice after whole colonies of bats began dying off in New England. Now the fungus ranges from Canada south to Virginia, Gargas said. Genetic evidence confirms the fungus in Europe, though there have not been reports of widespread die-offs there, she said. — *Susan Milius*

Boonsboro, MD - Tri-State Grotto returned to Crystal Grottoes Caverns to again work on a project. This time the Caverns requested that we do project #7: Excavating clay from a passage.

We met at 9 am and started soon after that. I took some before shots to be able to look back on and see what we did.

After placing some infrastructure, the diggers had buckets moving out by 9:30. We started with a dump wagon that held seven buckets. It was pushed to the bottom of the Back Door Passage, hooked to a strap and pulled it up the slope with a riding lawn mower. It worked well but with all the people we felt we could move the buckets faster without the wagon. A bucket brigade line formed and moved the buckets out.

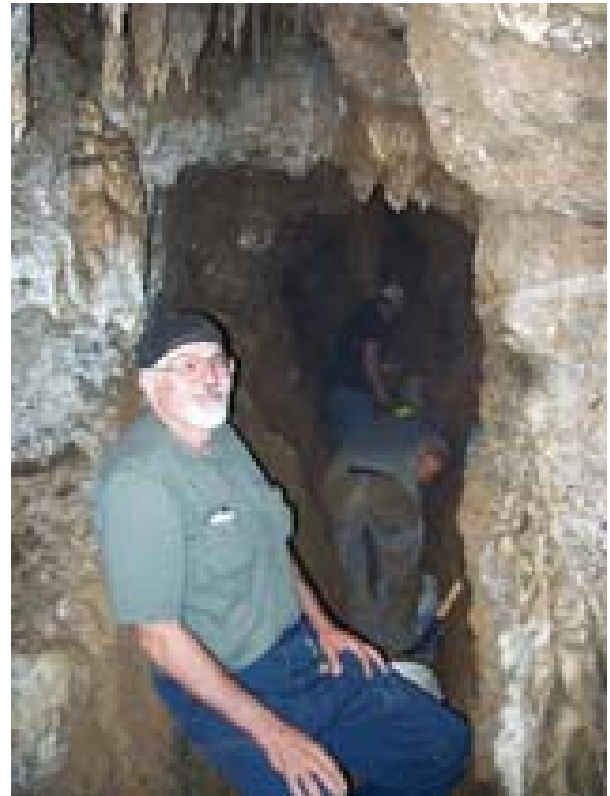

As the digging continued, word came that a void opened up near the ceiling and it had formations in it. We hand-dug near it and opened it up. After digging ten feet more we hit a stone wall.

To the bottom right of it the clay continued and we went that way. Word soon went out that we established a voice connection. Later it was a light connection. Finally, Sean climbed up and dug enough to get a sight connection.

As we removed Buckets of clay we found pieces of formations. They were carried and laid aside. A big knob was taken into the cave house. The rest were lined up by the back door.

After making the connections, voice, light and site, I took some shots of the formations in that little hole. We will return to finish digging that area out.

After we were done I went back and took after pictures. The first set is looking in to the new passage. As a reference, look at the formation at

the top of the photo. The new floor is really tacky. I'm sure it will firm up as it dries out.

We also looked through the cave for bats. We did not find any. They have not been seen for about four weeks according to caverns guide Sunny Floyd who is also a Tri-State Grotto Member. I live a few miles away and that evening I saw a bat working the area above my garden, so they are around.

Twenty-five people helped with the dig. We removed 312 buckets of clay. We started at 9:00 am and finished around 6:30 pm, and that included cleanup.

Pink Helictite Cave

Entrance Sinkhole Clean Up and Cookout

Looking for something productive and satisfying to do during OTR to fill the void left by voluntary and mandatory cave closures due to white nose syndrome? The Mountain State Grotto offers a worthy event: Pink Helictite Cave entrance sinkhole clean-up and cookout!

Please join us on Friday September 4th, 2009, from 9 am until 4 pm. We'll meet at the OTR site entrance gate at 9 am, and caravan for the 45-minute trip to the site in northern Pocahontas County, a few miles northwest of Durbin. Pink Helictite Cave is located on State secondary

route 250/1, about two miles north of U.S. Route 250, west outside of Durbin.

Trash bags, gloves, a delicious lunch and drinks will be provided. Wear sturdy shoes, and bring your best bag that trash enthusiasm!

Pink Helictite Cave has its entrance at the base of sinkhole adjacent to route 250/1. It had been used as a dump for many years. Water enters the cave from a spring that pours over the limestone cliff on one side of the sinkhole, and an overland run off that passes through the household trash-laden sinkhole, carrying pollutants into the area's karst groundwater system. The objective is to remove this source of groundwater pollution.

The Mountain State Grotto identified the trash problem and worked with the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection's Land Restoration group, and many tons of the largest and most obnoxious trash was removed via a contractor. Members of the Grotto found, however, that much household trash remained buried in the sinkhole, probably by sediment carried into the sinkhole during the many years that the secondary road ditch led into the sinkhole. The road ditch and easy vehicular access to the sinkhole were cut off, and Mountain State Grotto members commenced to finish the clean up.

Four trash pick-up sessions removing more than 2.5 tons of garbage have gotten the bulk of the remaining trash, but to rid the sinkhole of the source of groundwater pollution, more trash removal is necessary. With the help of many hands, we hope to reach clean, natural ground soon.
