Vigil held for baby found in Wythe Co. cave - WDBJ7 Home

About 50 came to the memorial January 30, 2011|By Chris Hurst | Reporter

WYTHE CO., Va.:

A community in Wythe County gathered at sunset to remember a baby who tragically died and was found in a cave. The vigil came together quickly on Facebook. Notices started going out yesterday. Tonight they met to honor a newborn at the very place where it was found.

One by one they started file in off the East Lee Highway. Sheriff's deputies gave them a place to gather-- about 50 people came to light candles and remember a baby none of them ever knew.

"I came out yesterday to put my stuff out here at the cave," says Chris Gray. "Before I was able to get to the other side of the park here, I made up my mind I'd love to have some kind of gathering."

Katie Viars went to high school with Ashley Meadows, the mother accused of putting the newborn in the cave. Pregnant herself, she says the act is unimaginable. "She had a baby shower planned and I bought her baby stuff," she says. "Just knowing that I have a baby girl, she had a baby girl... just feeling the baby kicking and everything how could somebody do that knowing the baby was in there."

Some left flowers, some sang, still others-prayed. Thinking about how long the child had
been there before being recovered. "Just
knowing that we're standing there at that cave
where that baby was in there for two weeks,
people driving by not even knowing that baby
was in there," says Heather Rankin.
"Just to remember the baby," says Viars. "Just to
remember that it's not right what happened."

Ashley Meadows' mother, Twila, is also charged with concealment of a body. Both are in jail without bond. Investigators still don't know if the baby was stillborn or put alive in the cave.



John Dale and crystal Hanson had their pictures taken as they came out of Stillhouse Cave. And finally, Trish shows us that she's happy to get dirty again.




The Dig at Crystal Grottoes Caverns Nine Inches Square





Jerry Downs provided tea to drink and for lunch he served pizza.



As they were digging, a few rocks were sent up. Some of them looked finished. The thought was that they were leftovers from when they built the stone walls going out the back door. Jarod came across one that was 9 inches square and about three feet long. Jerry had to back his tractor down and hook on to it. It spun its wheels when it tried to pull the rock up the slope. The gang grabbed the webbing and helped pull the rock out. Jerry kept it aside to use in the future. Later in the day a smaller version of the large rock was found. It barely fit into a wagon and was pulled up by hand.

Several times there were diggers in the passage above. This stopped people from working under them because of the amount of rocks that was falling. After they stopped and came down, the wagons started out the back door again.



100 wagon loads were taken out. That equals 300 drywall buckets. There were 16 volunteers who put in a total of 112 volunteer hours.

Crystal Grottoes Caverns

January 2011 Dig

Boonsboro – Tri-State Grotto returned to Crystal Grottoes Caverns January 15, 2011, to continue digging on the Tri-State Grotto passage. Walking into the cave house I found Jerry Downs, the owner, Sonny Floyd, the tour guide, and Zack Floyd.

Zack and I moved the wagons, shovels and buckets down to the dig site. As we waited for others to show up, Sonny showed me two bats and three bullfrogs. The bats were at the same spots in the cave as last year.



After a while we figured that no one else was coming, so we headed down to the dig. Zack and I put the wagon between us and threw clay onto it. Our plan was to fill all three wagons, then take them out, fill them up again, and take them out. And so it went.

Zack said that we should set a goal. We wanted to set a goal we could reach, but also a goal that we would have to work for. We set our goal at 100 buckets. When we broke for lunch we were up to 44 buckets. We felt that we would make our goal.

Before lunch we had cleaned up the clay on the left at the beginning of the Tri-State Grotto passage. Zack found that the rock at the point of the intersection didn't reach the floor when the clay was removed. It was three feet or so before







With the additional help we hit the dig hard. We had a floor level passage a shovel wide, up past the candlesticks. To our left was the clay bank that holds up the candlesticks. To our right was bedrock, sloping down toward our feet.



UPDATED: **Body of a newborn found in Wythe County cave** - wtvrSign

News UPDATED: Body of a newborn found in Wythe County cave. Police suspect the mother and grandmother hid the body of the newborn child in a cave

WYTHEVILLE, Va. UPDATED: Friday 2:10 p.m. —

Ashley April Meadows and her mother, Twyla J. Meadows, were arraigned Friday morning in Wythe County Juvenile and Domestic Relations court. The two are both charged with concealment of a body and are being held without bond.

Wythe County Sheriff Doug King tells News-7 the body of a newborn was found about 3:30 p.m. Thursday in a cave along Route 11 in the

Grahams Forge area. Social Services had received a tip about the situation. The child's body was sent to the medical examiner's office for autopsy. King says investigators have not yet been able to determine if the baby was stillborn or died in the cave. There were no obvious signs of trauma. Investigators believe the body could have been there for as long as two weeks. Sheriff King said the department has never dealt with a case like this before

The suspected mother and grandmother of a dead infant in Wythe County are charged with hiding the newborn's body in a cave. The Sheriff says deputies acted on an anonymous tip to social services. That tip lead them to a small cave in the Grahams Forge community in Wythe County. Deputies found the baby's body tucked away there.

20-year-old Ashley April Meadows and 60-year-old Twyla J. Meadows are charged with felonies. The newborn's cause of death hasn't been determined but more charges are anticipated in the case.

The law does allow being proven guilty before saying one is or not the same. However, I do believe if the pair did commit this act they should be punished. I cannot imagine a mother or any adult disposing of a baby fresh in the world. If they did not want the child there are so many who would love to have a gift as such of their own. There is no excuse for a senseless act. Shame on you both I hope they will live with their act for the duration of their lives. Sad though when people do such things I believe have lost a certain thing called conscious well before they did what they did. If they had not we would not be reading about them now. It is unfortunate there are people out here just like this walking, living and abiding in the same neighborhoods we who think sane live. We all must be careful as time goes by the people in this world are going to get worse and worse.


