Benedicts Cave Trip Report

Chris Coates and I got a late start leaving our house during the July 4th holiday weekend to project cave in Greenbrier County with other WVACS members. On Thursday we arrived at an empty Fieldstation and began to unload our vehicle. It was in the afternoon, so we did not have much time to devote to a project trip, so we decided to go on a sport trip to Persinger's Entrance to Benedicts Cave.

Benedicts Cave is a cave that we've never been to and have wanted to do a through trip for some time. So we geared up and began to go underground via the tight crawl way around 3 p.m. We entered the crawl feet first, feeling the way down the smallperson passageway. It was not far into the cave when we entered the main borehole and the Persinger Creek passage.

Armed with a map, we tried to navigate this multitlevel cave to the Benedict Entrance. The map was nice to have, but was hard to read since the levels are not offset, but stacked on top of each other, in the map. Through trial and error, we eventually found ourselves on the right track walking in Mediocre Creek. We followed the tall, canyon passage downstream until we reached a small crawl.

Upon further investigation, it looked like a belly crawl in the water. Not having waterproof packs, we opted not to get soaked and headed back towards the entrance.

Along our way out, we explored several of the parallel passages and familiarized ourselves with that section of the cave. It was a nice, short four hour trip to say that we got underground for the Fourth of July.

The three of us went to Poorfarm Pit, then up into Back side of Swago Creek area to look for some pits I knew Marion had never been to.

Unfortunately I had not been to these in 25 years. One was horribly overgrown in a multiflora rose thicket and I judged the tiny entrance impossible to access. This was Beverage Pit(49') . Guess Marion will have to put that one on his non-vertical list. I was able to relocate the deepest of the Forgotten Pits... No. 1 at 59', so the three of us bounced that one. We then headed back to Bill Balfours house where Marion and Sharon had spent the previous night, and had a very pleasant sleep.

Wednesday, July 31st

Woke to a chilly rainy morning. Bill showed me the entrance to a pit I'd never done called Shale Bank Pit just across the road from Elevator Shaft. I bounced and taped this at 48' while Marion and Sharon headed into Lewisburg for breakfast. I then drove up to WVAS to meet Bruce Fries for a prearranged trip into Savanna Lane. We picked up Marion and Sharon and the four of us entered the cave after chatting with the owner for a bit. We took the easier more scenic passage enroute to the pit drop into the big room. For a detailed description of this passage see the feature article in the July News.

The drop into the big room was supposed to be around 80 feet. I seldom go to a new pit without the "lie detector". Sharon and I taped it at 82', a very impressive drop. Bruce checked out the water level in the big room and I tagged along behind while Marion and Sharon climbed back up the pit. Bruce noted that the water was still to high to allow pushing the breakdown blockage at the far end. We exited to a cloudy drizzily mid-afternoon.

The drizzle only lasted a short while. A new shower was picking up as I took Marion and Sharon to Shale Bank Pit. Marion couldn't remember if he'd been to Elevator Shaft or not, so I next took both across the road and up the hill to this pit. It's a very pretty 66 footer, but the rain was getting serious so we quickly bounced it and then headed up the road to Pendleton County.

Thursday, August 1st

Though both had been to Shoveleater years before, there was a lot discovered since then, so we opted for a nice tour of some of the more impressive parts of the cave. Checked out lots of the pretties in Harper Canyon and HA and HB passages. Bounced Skyline Drop, which at 162' is the second deepest pit in the Shoveleater portion of the system. Next we headed over to Washington County just in time for a nice supper prepared by my wife.

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Friday, August 2nd, local stuff.

Checked out Schetromph which was heavily posted. I assume this was backlash from the big rescue featuring Jerry and Steven Bowen as the heroes. On to Whitings Neck. Went in collapsed sink entrance, back to drop which I taped at a maximum of 40', toured below drop, and went out main entrance. Encountered large group from Virginia. Mostly lads and lassies in the 10-14 age range with lead very capably by at least two young adults of different sexes. Leaders were emphasizing safety and team work. Kids were serious, attentive, polite, and having a great time. It was a real pleasure to witness all the positive interaction between them. We got out with some time to spare before our meeting with Corey, so we went on up to Indian River. The day was a bit warm but all in all pretty nice after the weeks earlier deluges.

Back at the parking area Corey soon arrived and off we went to George Washington Cave. Marion spent about an hour copying down what he felt were historical names. Then Corey took us over to his new digs in Sandy Hook and we finalized our plans for the next days trip to Tanglefoot.

Saturday, August 3rd The real cave trip.

Marion and I drove up to Corriganville for our 9:30 meeting with the rest of the crew. Sharon opted to go winery touring locally with my wife. Adam couldn't make it so Ali (Crosby) and Corey would survey the drier passage, and I volunteered Marion, Scott Walquist, and myself to do the mucky, but shorter first "hog waller". Our team got about 200' of survey while Corey and Ali surveyed over 300 feet. They were still going strong when we left them. I was impressed by Marion's performance in the cave. He only griped at a few nasty spots and generally seemed to enjoy himself.

Marion is 70(71 in Sept) years old. I told him I was pretty sure that he would remain the oldest person to ever do a through trip in Tanglefoot. It ranks as the most difficult non-vertical cave I've ever done, as it presents the explorer with one obstacle after another, and most cavers come out pretty trashed.

Scott, Marion, and I went to Pizza Hut for dinner. Then we bid Scott farewell and returned to see if Ali and Corey were out yet. They were not, but within about an hour we saw their lights bobbing along the trail. We compared notes and then Marion and I headed back to Smithsburg, arriving around midnight.

On Sunday morning we bid adieu to our guests as they departed for convention.




