



Falling Waters, WV - John Scrivener had gotten written permission for us to go to Nestle Quarry Cave. This was a big deal because people have been arrested there before.

I showed up and parked at the beginning of the lane so people could find it. First came John and his daughter Sarah. Then came Jerry Bowen and Steven followed by Mary, Melissa, and her two

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
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boys. Todd Zimmerman rounded out our group. We suited up and walked over to the quarry to show everyone how far down we were going. I told them that we would be in the stream going across the quarry floor.

We headed back and walked to the cave. Jerry had gone ahead and took his family in ahead of us and didn't see the quarry. As we were starting down, here came one of Jerry's grandsons popping out of the cave. I reached down and pulled him the rest of the way out. Todd went down. I went down, Sarah followed and John brought up the rear.

I always say that in Nestle Quarry Cave you go down into a room, at the bottom of the room is a hole, you go into the hole and you're in another room. We headed down through several rooms or levels and came to a cross section. Several people checked out the passage to the left and we headed down again. We were now entering the largest room in the cave.

We explored it before moving into the subway tunnel. We looked up that and checked out the rimstone pools. Water over time leaving the rimstone pools had left a lighter stain on the floor heading down to the stream passage.

We followed the passage down until we met the stream. Looking around we headed down stream. The passage was tall and lined with a lot of nice formations.

We worked our way down the passage until the water flowed under the wall. We turned around here and headed up stream.

We passed where we entered the stream passage and continued on.

We had to work our way around or through a shallow pond tat was right in front of a small hole that we had to climb through. Moving on we climbed across a mud bank and found a Longtail Salamander. The Longtail Salamander (Eurycea loongicauda longicauda), which is the only salamander that is yellowish with black vertical marks on its tail. Breeding underwater in the winter, the Longtail Salamander produces a clutch of 90 eggs. It eats insects, worms, arthropods and other terrestrial invertebrates. Several photos were taken before we moved on.

We made it to the headwaters of the stream. It was flowing out from underneath a ledge. After checking it out we turned the trip and started making our way out.

It was a great trip. We were in about an hour and a half.




