


Arriving at 9:30 am on the 24th of February, the grotto hurriedly put their gear in place. There was a large plastic pipe, 50 ft long, connected to a fan for ventilation. Extension cords were connected and threaded across the ceiling and run down the side of the passage. The Wacker was pulled out and moved down the drop.

Tom and Jeff dropped down the hole and looked around. It was thought to have had water pooled up by the dripping sounds that were heard from the top. There wasn't any water lying around, but there was a large rock laying there that had dropped out of the ceiling. When the end of the day was reached, there were 63 buckets hauled out in the morning and 100 buckets in the afternoon, for a total of 163 for the day.



Fox Skull Cave

We met up near the Falling Waters exit on I-81. We headed down the road to where we park. I made a quick side trip to a nearby guard shack to let them know what we were doing. A number of years ago they called the State Troopers out on us. This way they would know what was going on.



Tom, Mason and Terry M. were ready and headed off first. The rest of us put on our gear and went as a group.

Thinking that the others went in first, and if there were any animals in the cave, they would run into them before we did, we let Andrew Imes' sons lead us in. This was their first time in this cave.




