Tom, Gary, & Elysia went to Links Cave then Smoke Hole cave.


Tom & Terry surveyed Santas Chimney then went to Cascade cave. Bob then talked about Santas Chimney.

Smittys Pit AKA The "Sink Hole" By Tom Griffin

On 10-4-2018 I was texted by a friend who has a friend that hunts in Pendleton County WV. Smitty said, "I found this hole while hunting and almost fell in it." His own words, "It must go down 150 to 200 hundred feet." Being in the Smoke Hole area there was no reason not to believe him. After some texting back and forth we finally setup a meeting place and time.

On 10-20-2018 – Bob Bennett, Tom Griffin, Elysia and Gary Mathias headed to our meeting place and caught up to Smitty so he could walk us to this pit. We brought our long ropes and a rope to set between the trees for an easy ascent. The walk was about a ¹/₄ mile to the sink. We walked over the hill and found a nice opening with trees for an easy tieoff. It had really nice limestone walls, but then when you look down you could see the bottom from the top.

Somewhat disappointing, we set the ropes for the repel. Elysia and I did the drop. We found lots of metal in the bottom. Each time you moved the pile moved there was very little mud in the bottom. You could see that the rain kept the debris clean of the brown stuff that we seemed to run into a lot lately. After we came out, I used the Disto-x to find our depth to be between 32 and 35 feet.

The information was sent out to 2 of our friendly DNR people to check the GPS to see if we were actually on National Forest Land or private property. Our thoughts were that we were over top another known cave. There are rumors that there are other cave openings that have been found and never found again.

When the information came back it turn out this is a known cave that has been forgotten. It is known as "The Sinkhole". The cave was surveyed in December of 1971 by Bruce Smith, Sam Pitthan and Kelly Deem to a depth of 60 feet. Our GPS and the original survey GPS did not coincide.

I wrote Bruce about the Cave we ran into, and he says he remembers it well. He mentioned that there is a series of sinks in the area that seemed promising. With that Bob and I setup another trip.

On 11-3-2018 Bob and I headed back to this very brisk spot since it was on top of the mountain with the wind blowing about 20-40 mph. We checked for a few hours into different areas. Nothing found. So



we headed down the mountain since it was only a couple of hours before dark. We then looked for the parking space of another local cave and visited some locals in the area to see what they had to say about other sinks or holes in the area. The people around there are not interested in the caves but they are hunters that are familiar with the area. We will make plans to go back to follow more rumors.



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






