# TSG Meeting (13 people in attendance) 2/13/19

John called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Elysia gave the Treasurer's Report.

Doc reported the minutes of last month's meeting January 9, 2019.

Old Business: There is no activity concerning the tent poles due to cold and freezing weather. Doc purchased a Hyper Tough LED light and demonstrated the unit at the meeting. Members at the meeting were reminded to keep in touch with the TSG list serve in case there would be any new weekend trips going out in the near future.

The 2020 NSS Convention will be held at the Old Timers Reunion site in Daily, West Virginia. A local high school may be employed for extended convention events.

<u>Trips:</u> A large group of cavers including Elysia, Gary, and Tom visited Norman Cave and reported seeing the waterfall from both sides.

Adam, Mike and Doc went to Donaldson's Cave which was full of water. Someone apparently refreshed the historical markings in the main room.

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
