John called the meeting to order at 7:15 PM due to online issues.

Elysia's gave a Treasurer's Report and Doc read the previous meetings minutes. Cave bucks:32

Old Business:

- -The new TSG/ Crystal Grottos Caverns pamphlet was displayed and scrutinized. All the TSG officers had a draft sent to them for assessment. Cost of generating the pamphlet was discussed and a vote was taken with the result of printing a thousand units.
- -Pennsylvania's Sara's Furnace Cave is still being surveyed.
- -A discussion of Poor Farm Cave in Pocahontas County concerning a visitation two years ago took place. New plans are being made for the cave.
- -The TSG picnic was a success. Thirty-four cavers and three dogs attended.

New Business:

- -An Isaac Walton Cave survey that was preformed some time ago needs to be renewed. Plans to reach an agreement with the park officials to resurvey the cave will be held Thursday, September
- -There is a possibility that MAR/VAR may be postponed. The event could be held sometime in May 2022 if this year's event is once again cancelled. Plans are being made to contact the local health department for permits.
- -A new lock box is needed for Jones Quarry Cave and materials are available. Also, a new concrete barrier should be added to the eroding area under the gate.
- -NCRC is going to have a local class in the Martinsburg area.
- -The Adam Steven's Cave project continued on September the fifth. Ashby and company are in the process of scouting and digging outside the house in the area facing the creek in hopes of finding an additional opening to the cave. A grinding wheel, old signs, and a metal glider were uncovered. The signs have a historical content, and the grinding wheel is going to be examined.
- -A date has been set for next year's Heritage Day at the Adams Stevens House. It is to be held on May the fourteenth, which falls on the weekend after Mothers Day weekend.
- -There was a conversation of "Who do you call in a cave emergency?" Call 911 the police will make the contacts that handle caving emergencies. During a recent local caving trip someone requested information of a cavers safety that returned later than expected which started the conversation.

- -Adam, John, Ashby and Angela replaced bulbs on Friday, September third, at Crystal Grottos Caverns.

An alternative caving and camping festival mimicking the original OTR (Old Timers Reunion) that was cancelled for whatever reason for a second time. No Old Timers Reunion Two.

"We had nothing better to do over Labor Day weekend, so we attended NOTR2 instead and had a really good time."

OTR was going to be held this year from September the second through the sixth over Labor Day Weekend. Unfortunately, the local health department postponed it once again. Because of the festival's cancellation, many cavers like myself who not only bought provisions but was also looking forward to the festivities, made plans to go caving and camping anyway. One of the alternatives was to create our very own mini Old Timers Reunion.

I not only posted an invitation on Facebook but also personally invited other clubs and grottos to attend a fun filled caving weekend at Thorn Springs Campground just outside of Franklin, West Virginia. Almost immediately I received positive and excited replies from not only my regular caving acquaintances, but a host of others as well.

I arrived, Friday September third, to the campground at dusk and noticed that a good size group of approximately half a dozen or more cavers from RASS (Richmond Area Speleological Society) where already starting the traditional ORT night-time activities, which involved starting a campfire, cooking, and socializing.

Sir Adam, who rode with me, and I were invited to join their campsite. I brought my guitar and Sir brought the beer. We had a festive time until midnight whereupon one by one, tired cavers retired to their tents.

The nest day, a group consisting of Todd, Sir, Doyle, and myself, planned to visit Hamilton Cave, which is almost walking distance from the campground. Other cavers wanted to visit Flower Pot Cave. Flower Pot Cave was closed a few years ago when the owner passed away so I advised that someone should make an inquiry of the caves status. The cave is presently closed, and that troop made plans to visit Kee Cave instead.

Our trip to Hamilton Cave was spectacular. The weather was perfect and climbing the path up Pickle Mountain to get to the cave was slow going. The clean air was a not only refreshing but also energizing making the ascension acceptable. Caving itself was amazing and remarkable, visiting both the mudroom and crawling to the big slab room. Promises were made to return soon.

Before returning to camp, we stopped in town for a fast-food meal and then headed back to camp. The merriment continued, but this time with many more cavers.

Another rather large crowd of cavers rented a cabin on the other side of the campground. There were close to over twenty people from Virginia and West Virginia that arrived while we were away.

We headed home on Sunday, although many other NOTR2 participants stayed one more day with the intention of getting back home on Monday. There were no hot tubs, bands, dancing, food vendors or a vendors' row, but considering the health emergency, we had a great weekend. NOTR2 was fun, time filling, and very connected. Hopefully we will not have a health emergency again next year with another cancellation a third time in a row. Nevertheless, this year we made our own festival. All the cavers and campers enjoyed this alternative event, which turned out to be a smaller and intimate fun OTR style experience.

Sept. 24th: Cold Fingers Pit and Armstrong Pit, Pocahontas County, WV

Ryan Mauer and his girlfriend Hope, Nathan Roser, and I hiked up the mountain on the Kyle Hause property in the Swago area south of Marlinton. The goal was for Ryan to photograph the new pit found at the bottom of Cold Fingers by Shawn Hogbin last January. Over Labor Day weekend Corey enlarged the squeeze that had schedded Shawn on his discovery trip last winter in order that we could all fit without giving a "pound of flesh". At that time Corey, Keely Owen, Shawn and I did the first (and so far only) descents of the virgin 64-foot pit. It's a gorgeous pit (one of the prettiest in the state despite not being very deep). As it's discoverer, Shawn had the honor of naming it. He christened it Seasonally Hallowed Well. I wanted Ryan to get a good picture of it for an article I'll be writing soon for the West Virginia Caver on what I'm calling the Kyle Hause Project. However, it had rained three inches in the area early that week. The new pit was as wet as it was on the day Shawn first saw it back in January, when in addition to getting shredded, he also got soaked to the bone. Ryan, Nathan, and I all bounced the 28-foot entrance pit, but the photo of Seasonally Hallowed Well will have to wait for a drier time. Then we went over to Armstrong Pit. Nathan and Hope had never been there before so the three of us sans Ryan bounced it. It's a 33-

Sept. 25th: Sliding Rock Cave, Bedford County, PA twelve-hour trip - I drove back from Pocahontas County late Friday night so I could join Corey's group for a Sliding Rock trip on Saturday. I'd been on three survey trips there before, but Corey and company had found quite a bit of new passage since my last trip, and it sounded interesting. On this trip would be Corey, Keely, Reilly Blackwell, Sean Lewis, and I. Sliding Rock is an interesting cave which has rapidly become the largest and deepest cave in Bedford County. It's also by far the most difficult. Corey says he would have no objection to me writing a story about the cave, and I might do that sometime in the near future, but for now here's just a short summary.

There are a lot of obstacles in the entrance series of the cave as it quickly drops down to around 200 feet in depth via numerous climbdowns and some short rappels. Some tricky rigging by Corey on what was probably our third trip led to some fairly extensive horizontal passages, some of which were crawling, some were walking/stooping, some were pretty nice, and some were sloppy. On our next trip we got into some well-decorated and fairly easy passages but were stopped by constrictions. Corey has since enlarged these to where a caver of average girth should be able to negotiate them with determination, though I did grunt a lot. Beyond the awkward squeezes Corey had found several hundred feet of pretty decent passages and what is probably the largest room in Bedford County. I enjoyed my tour of this. We split into two survey teams to push leads, with the combined new survey from both teams amounting to around 500-600 feet. Corey reported that the cave is currently only about 400 feet shy of being a mile long. -Terry M




